It is 103 pages long but has a lot of detail guidelines that we need to refer to if reviewing a boat shed activity or policy, as our Insurance is based on the mens shed safety Manual.

It has approved plant use guideline from table saws, routers, and even to screw drivers

Oldies are especially vulnerable

'Many senior athlete injuries happen when they recognize that some of their physical strength and skills have lost their edge. Fear and pride take over and to avoid others from seeing them struggle, they push themselves to the point of injury'. Golden Oldies Coach.

In the Men's Shed environment, we recognise the above Health & Safety trap.

Members of the Australian Men's Shed Association and our boatshed have a Duty of Care to themselves, their Shed colleagues, family members and visitors to operate safely so that afterwards we can return home to our loved ones unharmed.

AND apart from the Insurance aspect Health & Safety Legislation

Federal and State laws require that management provide a safe working environment and safe work systems.

In order to help meet these obligations you are expected to advise management of any safety hazards or problems that you come across. The laws require that you must take care to ensure the health and safety of others who are on the premises including other workers, family or visitors.

Australian National Maritime Museum

As the national centre for maritime collections, exhibitions, experiences and knowledge, we are custodians of historic vessels and a cultural hub for Australian maritime heritage and contemporary stories of the sea. These stories come to life for visitors at our Sydney Harbour site. Sydney Heritage fleet is part of the Museum . It similar to LMCBA volunteers but 20 times larger .

Intended Trips

1&2 Trips to both Sydney Heritage Fleet at *Darling Harbour* and also workshops at *Rozelle*.

The Fleet now comprises 10 historical vessels which is amongst the largest such collection in Australia. A community-based non-profit organisation, the Fleet's mission is:

To build and maintain an internationally recognised centre of excellence in maritime heritage for the benefit of all Australians by presenting through research, acquisition, conservation, restoration, education and operation, our continuing maritime history.

The Fleet's 1200 strong membership and 450 dedicated <u>volunteer workers</u> restore, operate and maintain the fleet of vintage vessels. In the process they preserve traditional technical methods and skills.

3 Cockatoo Island Restoration

Volunteers at Cockatoo Island continue to use their lifetime of skills to restore the heritage *of C*ockatoo Island including the No. 2 Travelling Steam Crane.

The return of the ferry Fitzroy a 1928 ferry not only brings the story full circle but also provides the Harbour Trust with a timely opportunity to preserve Australia's maritime heritage. Constructed by Cockatoo Island Dockyard apprentices using spotted gum, it was used to ferry dockyard workers to and from the island during the period from 1928 to 1963.. This is being restored at present.

As is restoring an RAN Captains Launch built in 1945. Designation- Fast Motor Boat Sydney– 45802.
